REINTEGRATION - THE WATCHWORD

In a word, the way in which nursing can be practiced and taught most fully is “reintegration”. This word means returning to performing all the traditional roles of nursing while incorporating new theories and technologies. Belief in this concept means that the full spectrum of nursing is available and that people seeking nursing care receive care that is geared uniquely to their needs.

After 20 years of full-time employment at the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center, Dr. Jones functions now as an independent professional. Dr. Jones continues selective involvement in each aspect of the reintegrated professional nursing role. In developing this concept during her career, in her professional practice, Dr. Jones has been involved in:

Education

Dr. Jones has taught graduate, undergraduate and continuing nursing education courses in basic nursing, advanced practice in primary care, and rural nursing.

Scholarship

Dr. Jones was Project Director of the W.K. Kellogg funded KARENET Project and the federally funded “Education and Practice: Beyond Collaboration” project which demonstrated the value of research utilization in clinical nursing. Her research interests have emphasized clinical demonstration and evaluation, as well as rural health issues and health promotion. More recently she guided the project to place TTUHSC School of Nursing’s primary care graduate courses on the World Wide Web to improve access for remote students and to increase graduates’ abilities to use information technology.

Practice

Dr. Jones worked as a member of the management team for the 4 South Project, a clinical management project of the School of Nursing on an in-patient unit of St. Mary of the Plains Hospital and consulted on management in several clinical sites. Jones developed and implemented HealthCoRe, a health promotion service for Texas Tech University female athletes. She has practiced in primary care since 1993 and developed the TTUHSC School of Nursing’s Primary Care Clinic - the Wellness Center, a site for primary care of the underserved. Since 1998, she has written a monthly health promotion column for the Texas Farmer-Stockman magazine as another approach to affecting the health of individuals.

Dr. Jones served on the Health Sciences Center Executive Council; Chair of the Graduate Curriculum Committee; and Chair of the Telenetworking Steering Committee of the Health Sciences Center among numerous committee appointments.
